On February 18, 2019, after 102 days at sea, the Raven KASTER ran aground in Western Ireland.

The boat had been found by a local fisherman Darren Kilbane on Dookinella beach on the south side of Achill Island on the West coast of Ireland.

Miniboats and Ireland Trip

We didn't hear much about the miniboat after it was recovered in 2019, but on January 21, 2022 it appeared in a posting on Facebook by the Achill **Experience, Aquarium and Visitor Centre.**

Cassie Stymiest, Executive Director - Educational Passages, contacted us about our miniboat, giving us hope that we could visit Ireland and realize our dream - to relaunch the Raven KASTER! We envision connecting with people of Achill Island and Ireland, to create new stories and continue our science adventures.

In 2021, three miniboats landed on the south coast of Newfoundland. We volunteered to help Patrick Wells (MUN Science Education Researcher), to relaunch the boats - this stirred up further interest in relaunching Raven KASTER in Ireland. Our efforts attracted interest from NTV News. Once again Beth Penney, who first reported our story in 2019, featured us in a, "Your Community" NTV Evening News segment that aired on March 25, 2022.


Raven KASTER was launched in November 2018. 102 days later in February 2019, it washed ashore in Ireland in February 2019.
